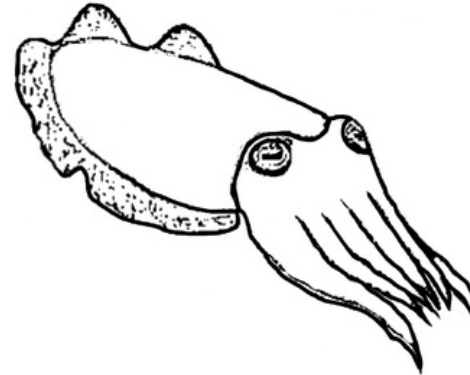
Sandown Bay is a Marine Conservation Zone! Here are some of the animals I met who live in the Bay! Help me finish off my research by colouring in my sketches!



Undulate Ray

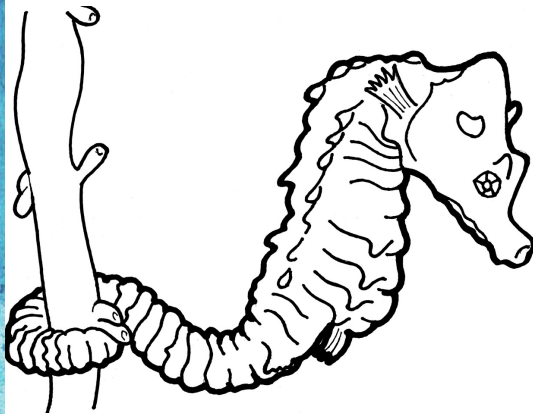
How big am I: Up to 90 cm
Am I rare?: I am Endangered
How old am I?: I can live for more than 20 years
When can you see me?: All year round
What I like to eat?: Crab, Shrimp and other flatfish
What is my Scientific Name?: Raja Undulate

Common Cuttlefish



How big am I?: up to 45cm
Am I rare?: I am Common
How old am I?: I can live for up to 2 years
When can you see me?: All year round
What I like to eat?: Crab, Shrimp and other flatfish
What is my Scientific Name?: Sepia Officinalis

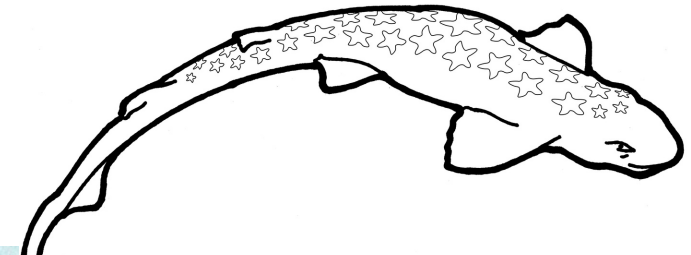
Short Snouted Seahorse



How big am I?: 14cm to 16cm
Am I rare?: Vulnerable
How old am I?: I can live up to 10 years
When can you see me?: All year round
What I like to eat?: Small shrimp and plankton
What is my Scientific Name?: Hippocampus.

Spotted Catshark

How big am I?: can grow anywhere from 75cm up to 100cm
Am I rare?: I am Common
How old am I?: I can live for more than 12 years.
When can you see me?: All year round.
I like to eat?: crab, snails, squid, worms and other small fish .
My Scientific Name is?: Scyliorhinus Canicula.
